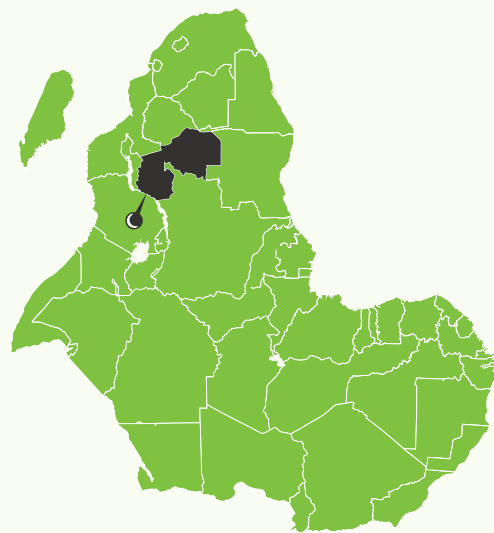

MYTH & FACTS ABOUT TOBACCO GROWING:

-  **Myth:** Tobacco Growing is bad for environment.
-  **Fact:** Tobacco grows on 0.25% of the world cultivated land. Its production is not a threat compared to other agriculture activities.
-  **Myth:** Tobacco growing is bad for Growers' health
-  **Fact:** The only health risk that is unique to tobacco is green tobacco sickness
-  **Myth:** Tobacco Growing exacerbates poverty and contractual arrangements trap farmers
-  **Fact:** Tobacco is a cash crop and the chief incentive for tobacco growing is that it is more profitable than most of crops.
-  **Myth:** Child Labour is a particular problem in tobacco growing
-  **Fact:** Child Labour is a problem in agriculture sectors across the developing world, a fact which is recognised by the International Labour Organization (ILO).
-  **Myth:** Tobacco Growing aggravates food security
-  **Fact:** There is no evidence to support this assertion. Tobacco only covers 0.25% of cultivated land. At macro-level tobacco cannot be considered a threat to food security
-  **Myth:** There are many economically sustainable alternatives to tobacco farming
-  **Fact:** Tobacco generally grows well on marginal soils where other crops do not grow well. If economically sustainable alternative crops were available to millions of farmers, certainly many more farmers would have adopted them.

- Educating women generates additional benefits due to women passing their knowledge onto next generation.
